## The PLAN: Establish Three Teams for Church Renovations.

Guidelines: Each team will consist of at least five individuals including at least one trustee.

- I. Team responsibility.
- A. Decide on actual completed project deliverables.
  - 1. Colors.
  - 2. Commercial quality.
  - 3. Methodist church compatibility.
  - 4. Historic fit.
  - 5. Time line.
  - 6. Within agreed upon cost/budget.
- B. Insure church member input before final selection.
  - 1. Present options
- 2. Have at least one open meeting for discussion
- 3. Provide samples where appropriate (ex carpet, paint color, siding, etc.)
- 4. Provide pictures for temple talks before services.
- 5. Keep records as to opinions, concerns and vote for decsions.
- C. Responsible to trustees for delivering results.
- 1. Any concerns which cannot be settled in team, Trustees will make decision.
- 2. Trustees will be responsible for final contract approval on all items.
- 3. Scheduling of renovations will be coordinated by trustees in best interest of overall project.
- 4. All potential bidders must be fully insured with workers compensation, damage and work completion insurance.
- 5. All work will have start and completion dates.

#### **Confirmation Class Reminder**

Confirmation Class- This class will start on April 3rd and end on Pentecost Sunday, which is May 15th. This class is open to 6th-8th grade students, and will take place at the Cove during the normal Sunday school hour (9:45-10:45). There will be a separate Sunday school class offered at the same time for any student who has already been through Confirmation or is not interested in doing so. If any high school students have not been confirmed and are interested in doing so, they should talk to Drew for more information.

Students will be expected to attend every session of the seven week course. In order to complete Confirmation, students may not miss more than two classes throughout the seven weeks, and they will need to make up the information from those classes that they missed. Additionally, at least one parent of each child that goes through the class will be required to attend a parent Confirmation class that Pastor John will teach during those weeks.

He will be going through the same curriculum in the parents class that we will be covering in the class for students, which will allow the parents to discuss the Confirmation class with their children. In the event that a parent is unable to attend Pastor John's class, a sponsor may go in their place. That class will also take place during the Sunday school hour, and will be open to any adults who would like to attend it, including those who do not have children that will be attending the Confirmation class.

This class will be a great opportunity for students to become more rooted in their faith as we discuss the core truths of Christianity and how these truths impact the life of a Christian. Please see Drew or Pastor John for more information about the Confirmation class.

#### Rejoice in Forgiveness

When God created humans in his image, we were perfect. But after sin entered the world, we needed a Savior. The good news of Easter is that Jesus, God's Son, died on the cross for our sins and then rose again. Because of Jesus' victory, we can receive the free gifts of forgiveness and eternal life.

Jesus tells us, as forgiven people, to also extend forgiveness to others who wrong us. That isn't always easy, especially when an offender doesn't seem sorry. But Jesus helps us follow his example of offering love, compassion, and forgiveness—even to our enemies

Writer Peter Ustinov called love "an act of endless forgiveness." A constant focus on forgiveness is especially important in families. Every day, hurt feelings, grudges, and slights interfere with our relationships with the people we love most.

Children need to experience the feeling of being forgiven to begin forgiving others. They also must learn that forgiveness is more than just accepting an apology. It also involves resisting the urge to retaliate, get even, or make someone pay for mistakes. We become vulnerable as we allow that person back into our lives—and that's also a big part of loving others.

As you help your children understand that Jesus forgives them and that they can forgive others, share the joy and freedom that comes from both experiences. Read on to learn practical ideas for exploring forgiveness as a family.
